THOUGHT / DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

2. Have you ever gotten blood on your clothes? What did it do to the garment? So, how is it that blood *cleanses* us, according to the New Testament? Why blood?
3. If you have received the your “garment of salvation,” (Galatians 3:27) and it becomes spotted, or stained, through sin, how might you cleanse it again? In other words, what do you do? Use Scripture to support your answer.
4. In your group discussion, talk about the *CONDITIONAL* state of our salvation. Address the simplicity of it, yet at the same time, how we make it so complex.
5. Consider the beautiful descriptions of spiritual cleansing found in Psalm 51:6-17. What are the implications you infer from the passage? How might it be related to today's sermon topic?
