The Model Prayer has two parts: (a) Praising God and (b) Asking God.

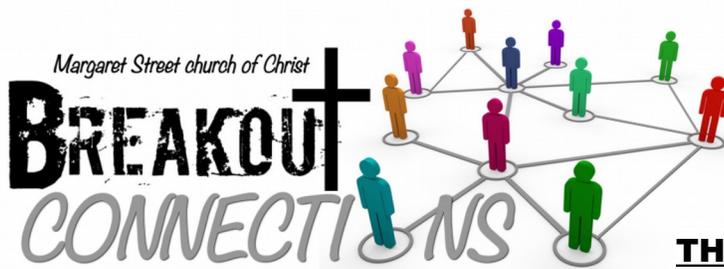
