PENMAN: Moses, David, Solomon, + POSITION: OT - Wisdom

PERIOD: 1440-586 BC PLACE: Israel (primarily)

PHASE: Between Moses - Captivity PUBLIC: Israel (Mankind)

KEY POINTS:

To provide poetry for the expression of praise, worship, and confession to God

PARTICULARS:

The name, "Psalms" and "Psalter" came from the Septuagint Hebrew title is **Tehillin** (meaning "praises" Ps 145)

Written to be sung or spoken

Hebrew poetry is characterized by rhythm (of words and tones) and by parallelism, or contrasts - Not meter (accented syllables) or rhyming like Western poetry.

David wrote 73 psalms, Asaph wrote 12; the sons of Korah wrote 9; Solomon wrote 2; Heman (with the sons of Korah); Ethan, and Moses each wrote one; 51 psalms are anonymous. The NT ascribes two anonymous psalms (Ps 2 & 95) to David
