



KEY POINTS:


Testament = "Covenant, Agreement" *"signifies a mutual undertaking between two parties or more, each binding himself to fulfill obligations …"*

THE HISTORY OF REDEMPTION

- We can find Jesus in every book and on every page.
- The message of the Bible, in short, is this: the Old Testamert teaches "Christ is coming," the gospel accounts teach that "Christ has come," and the remaining NT books teach that "Christ is coming back again."




THE WONDERFUL BIBLE!


KINGS AND PROPHETS CHART

- 612 B.C. Babylonia invade Assyrians
- 606 B.C. First deportation of Judean captives into Babylonian captivity

- 596 B.C. Second deportation of Judean captives
- 586 B.C. Third deportation with destruction of the temple
- 536 B.C. First return campaign led by Zerubabbel
- 520 B.C. Completion of the temple rebuilding

PARTICULARS:

Lament is a cry – pleading out to God Book is entirely poetic 1-4 Written in "acrostic" form – with 22 letters of Hebrew 5th poem is a final prayer

KEY PASSAGES:

- 1:12; 2:5-6, 17
- 3:25,33,40; 5:21

KEY PHRASES: "Sorrow" (3x) "tears" (3x); "He hath fulfilled his word" (2:17)

So Lamentations 2

GREAT LESSONS:

Lamenting is an expression of faith – Ch 3 (pleading with one who can actually help) Even in terrible judgment, God is a God of hope (3:24-25)

Sin brings misery and judgment

Bondage of sin can be avoided by repentance

Parallel: Jesus – weeping, Gethsemane, cry out on cross

value of divine chastening (Heb 12:5)
